Eastertide Greetings Friends.

What a joyous celebration Easter day was for so many of us who were able to join for in-person worship and those following our podcasts. Holy Week started off on a high note with us marching around the church grounds to beautiful sounds of the; "All glory, Laud and Honour". This set the tone as Holy Week was splendid and then entering the Triduum on Maundy Thursday with the celebration of the institution of the Eucharist. Our Good Friday services were well attended and although different to our marathon 3-hour service, it remained meaningful in so many ways. On Holy Saturday, there was a very different buzz around the grounds to that of the sombre Good Friday, with the cleaning and beautifying of the church with the many beautiful floral creations-this really set the tone for the celebration of the Resurrection.

On Easter morning, we commenced our Easter celebrations in the graveyard (a symbolism of death) and entered with the Paschal candle into the Church (a symbol of resurrection). What a joy and privilege this was.

So we continue to celebrate the great 50 days of Easter. As we reflect on the resurrected Christ who begins to appear to various individuals, and groups, we too seek ways of experiencing the risen Jesus.

It's the liturgical readings for this season which invite us as a community into experiencing the risen Christ. As we get a glimpse of a Jesus who has been raised to life, we are called to contemplate how we are to respond.

One of the meaningful parts of the Easter Liturgy is the renewal of our baptismal promises, and one of the promises we make is **to faithfully play our part in the life and fellowship of the Church**.

As a Parish, we are in an exciting space as we look at ways of expressing our gifts and talents in resurrecting ministry within the Church of God. We have an opportunity to bring our baptismal promises to life, as we seek ways of playing our part in the life of the Church.

We are called to look at ways wherein all of God's people are free and comfortable to express that which God calls us too. A few examples of ministry available in the Church and seeking renewal include: reading at divine services and assisting with the welcoming of people to our services (sides person). We are also open to new ideas around ministry and how it is expressed, so please pray about responding to the call of God and how you can offer to serve in this our Church.
