CROSS OF NAILS ANNIVERSARY IN SOUTH AFRICA

Peace, justice, and reconciliation

... these are the goals at the centre of every Cross of Nails partner. Cross of Nails is an initiative that was formed after the Second World War when Coventry Cathedral, Britain was destroyed by German bombers. On the floor two charred beams had fallen to form a cross and the words "Father forgive" were written on the walls of the cathedral.

Provost Dick Howard charged all to work together with their enemies to build a kinder, more Christ-like world. The leaders of Coventry Cathedral soon formed partnerships with churches in the cities of Kiel, Dresden, and Berlin.

Forging global connections

In line with the global Cross of Nails call to meet and partner with other countries and regions (both practically and prayerfully) Good Shepherd- Protea Cross of Nails has welcomed visiting partners from Germany and Coventry. Locally we work across cultures with talks called "Healing the wounds of History" that address the issue of race relations and apartheid in South Africa.

The power of prayer

The Good Shepherd – Protea partner of Cross of Nails has prayer at the centre of its work. Whether praying on the eve of an election, doing prayer walks or prayer chains – our 'Companions to the Community' have felt the power of prayer and gather together the first Friday of every month in the Lady Chapel in St Saviour's Church, Claremont, from 12 noon for half an hour, to pray.



So, the question is what to do in the meantime... Well in the meantime we wait and pray. In waiting and praying it gives us time to seek the will of God.


