RECTORS NOTE

Advent tide greetings friends and family of St. Saviour's.

Much of the political landscape in our country recently has been around the promise of a NEW DAWN, citizens have been anticipating a New Dawn only to be met with Blackouts, Lockdowns, and the perpetual CORRUPTION. Advent is about waiting in anticipation for the New Dawn, which brings with it the Word Incarnate; Jesus Christ, the Son of God, coming to dwell in us and amongst us.

One commentator speaks of Advent as: "HOLY WAITING". This I believe is really the space we are called to navigate, a space of Holy waiting, waiting for the coming of Jesus, but waiting in a space of holiness. Too often we confuse holiness with piety. I think authentic Holiness is centred around the goodness which God has created us in, through and for. Holy waiting challenges us to anticipate the coming of Christ, whilst being good, doing good and being used for good. Holy wanting challenges us to break out of compliancy into a space of doing, and sustaining that doing through acts of LOVE, JOY, PEACE and HOPE, all whilst living out the truth of God.

May this Advent tide be one of HOLY WAITING. God Bless. Fr. Chesnay

ADVENT CANDLE LIGHTING LITURGY¹

WEEK 1: HOPE

READER A: "Hope is being able to see that there is light despite all of the darkness."

READER B: "Hope is the thing with feathers that perches in the soul — and sings the tunes without the words — and never stops at all."

READER C: "Hope is like peace... It is a gift only we can give one another."

READER A: Friends, as we enter this Advent season, we come to this space familiar with the darkness and hungry for hope.

READER B: So today we light the candle of hope as a prayer, a protest, and a reminder that darkness will not win.

READER C: Violence will not win.

READER A: Corruption will not win.

READER B: Death will not win.

READER C: Prejudice will not win.

READER A: Racism will not win.

READER B: Terrorism will not win.

ALL: Love will win.

READER C: For, "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came into being through him.

All: In him was life, and the life was the light of all people. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it."

(light candle)

Loving God, we constantly find ourselves in darkness, shoulder deep in violence, grief, and a million reasons to give up hope. Yet every time we are there, you breathe life and light into our bones, refusing to give up on us. So please, God, draw close to us once more.
