Firstly, we are looking to get a soup kitchen running once a week on a Wednesday after our morning Eucharist – if you are keen to volunteer, speak with me. Furthermore, to mark our one year anniversary at the Parish, which is on the 26th of July my family and I will be opening the Rectory for social visits to organisations and parishioners to visit with us, as we get to know each other better and build stronger bonds of affection.
