Today, on this Fourth Sunday after Pentecost, our Lectionary takes us to that well-known Sunday School story of David and Goliath, a story where we were always reminded how strong and mighty Goliath was, and how timid David was, yet he managed to take down this giant. Seldom do we reflect on the confidence of David, to go into battle with just 5 pebbles, a sling and the favour of God.

As we navigate our way through the ever-changing scenes of life, we are invited to reflect on the confidence we are offered through our Baptism into the death and resurrection of Jesus. We are challenged to live out this confidence, not through arrogant actions, but humble service to God, and God's people.

David goes into battle confidently. We are facing many battles, and the first piece of armour we need to clothe ourselves with is confidence - confidence in the love of God. Today let us immerse ourselves in God's love for us; let us celebrate the promise of God with us, even when we are facing GIANTS, even when we allow the world to offer us an armour and we struggle to walk in it. Take it off and clothe yourself with the confidence of the love of God.

Please keep us in prayer as we withdraw for a short time in order to be closer connected to you our St. Saviour's family. We remain excited about what God has in store for us here and we continue to witness these blessings come to life daily.
