





ST. SAVIOUR'S

SEPARATE BUT CONNECTED IN LOCKDOWN

Last week, the President in his address to the nation, announced that the country would revert to Level 3 Lockdown regulations. This signalled a lot of different adjustments to different people. Religious leaders, educators, businessmen, parents and learners would all be affected by the official announcement of the third wave of the Corona Virus. This announcement, as in the past, caused a lot of jitters and uncertainty among the various sectors of society.

Religious leaders feel very strongly that they should be included in the drawing up of these regulations. This sector wants to be recognised for the important role it plays when people are affected by the virus or die as a result, claims the South African Religious Forum. The level 3 regulations allow only 50 people in an indoor religious service and 100 outside and only 50 may attend a funeral. These regulations are obviously in place to protect us against the deadly virus, but many people are unhappy about the general application. The parliamentary portfolio committee acknowledges the important role religious communities play in facilitating behaviour change and helping to prevent the spread of the virus, but the Forum feels it is not being taken seriously.

How did you respond to Lockdown? Here are some of your thoughts:

"I believe that our Rector was fairly proactive. Firstly, he had Wi-Fi installed in the church. Major services can be live-streamed and although we cannot be physically present, we feel part of the service. On Wednesdays we are again spiritually connected by means of Fr. Chesnay's #Wednesday word which, I am sure, most of us look forward to. The rector is conducting baptism classes personally and he was adamant he would do funerals himself in order to get to know the parents of children to be baptised and to get closer to the bereaved families."

"The Covid-19 virus has been very disruptive to our way of life and brought us several challenges. It has established a new normal in our way of life, for which washing of hands or sanitisation, wearing of a mask, social distancing and discouragement of mass gathering have been advocated."

"Our connectedness during Lockdown has been made possible and enhanced by means that, not long ago, would have been unthinkable. A surprising number of churches have found themselves obliged to hone their worship to remain relevant and alive in a new and developing historical context."

It seems unlikely that there will ever be a full return to business as usual where Christian religious observance is concerned."
