Dear Family and Friends of the Parish

This week, I felt a feeling I last felt in 2010 when South Africa hosted the FIFA Soccer World Cup and we were all proud to be South African and exhibited what it means to be community. What are the fragments of our life which we are called to pick up? What are the fragments within society, which we cannot afford to or want to lose?

Let us heed to the call; the call to **GATHER UP THE FRAGMENTS**.

Soon, we will have the privilege of gathering for in-person worship. As we do so, let us do so with the intention to pick of the fragments. May we use this opportunity to renew our faith and our expression thereof. Let us return to Worship, with the sole purpose to worship God in word and action.

In the Rectory, Samantha is doing better. She is gaining strength daily and the pain is subsiding as the days move along. On-line school has started so the stress of getting Sarah to do school work is at an all-time high. Noah continues to enjoy most of the attention and is growing really well.

We miss you all, and thank you for your prayers during what was indeed a challenging time for us.
