Dear Family, Friends and Parishioners

Greetings.

This week has been one of those weeks marred by messages of death, illness and families struggling with grief and loss. Social media is awash with 'RIP' messages and live streamed services of funerals. This is not NORMAL, we are not used to having to navigate constant sadness, sorrow, and despair. We have been created for goodness and have become accustomed to lives of goodness. I recall in March last year, many of us prepared for 21 days of Lockdown and then everything will be back to normal, here we are more than 500 days into lockdown, and we are further away from normal than we ever were. Whilst many of us try to adapt to this new way of being, one cannot help but be mindful of the many who will never be able to get past these traumatic moments.

It is in our Gospel reading for today, that we find hope- a Jesus who offers all of himself to each of us, a Jesus who invites us to consume that which he is, not for the benefit of Christ, but for our benefit, so that we may enjoy the gift of eternal life. Our lives have been consumed by negativity over the last while. Let us use this seminal moment to reflect on what it is that we are consuming. How much of what we are consuming is JESUS?

This past Wednesday, at our midweek Eucharist, I reflected on the words of that Gospel song; HEART OF WORSHIP. A gentle reminder that at the heart of all we do ought to be Jesus. The chorus reads as follows;

I'm coming back to the heart of worship And it's all about You It's all about You, Jesus I'm sorry, Lord, for the thing I've made it When it's all about You It's all about You, Jesus

As we find ways of worshipping differently, may we always have at the heart of it, the desire of consuming Jesus, the deep longing to make all we do about Jesus, this is what our faith calls us too, in times such as these, to get back to the heart of worship.

God Bless. Stay safe. Sanitise. Wear your mask. Avoid large gatherings.
