Today, our Samuel reading, the story of Hannah, reminds us like Hannah to find ourselves in a space to pour out our heart to the Lord. The Lord knows our heart: the question is do we? Do we really understand and know what's happening in us and through us? The story of Hannah invites us to pour out our hearts to the Lord, thus allowing us to acknowledge and recognise that which is happening in us and through us. Whilst doing so, whilst pouring out we allow God to pour in. God pours in!
