Daily reflection

This morning, after 2 days on a silent retreat, I woke up to the stark realisation that for the first time in what seems to be 3 years at least, I had a dream whilst sleeping. This was nothing spiritual - it was not some kind of vision: it was simply a dream. Maybe medicine and science have a way of explaining it, but for me, taking it on face value, it was a great teaching experience.

Upon reflecting on this, I realise that for the last 3 years I have probably either been way too busy, way too tired, or both, that when I lay my head down on my pillow to sleep, I would simply do just that: sleep. This sleep would be interrupted by an alarm or Noah crying and then lead to a flurry of things which I suddenly remembered I needed to do or forgot to do. Of late I have even slept through Noah's cries.

To dream, as I have now come to experience, calls on us to be at peace, to be calm, and simply to enjoy the moment. I always had this image that being busy, hard at work enables the dream to come alive but upon reflecting on how long ago I had an actual dream, the question is: what am I busy with?

So, if I am wanting to bring a dream to life, I would first need to stop, rest and pray, then allow myself to enter the space where I am actually able to dream and then get to working towards that dream, otherwise all I am doing is being a hamster on a running wheel, going nowhere.

This has been a beautiful and holy moment! May I remember the gift of rest and how it invites me to a space where I can dream.
