





# ST. SAVIOUR'S

Dear Friends, Lenten greetings.

Today marks the final Sunday of Lent, as we celebrate Passion Sunday next week. This Lenten journey has been filled with deep and profound revelations for many. As a Parish we have embarked on a journey of healing and wholeness and in last week's instalment of our Lenten reflections, we considered the difference between restoration and transformation.

I believe for authentic healing to manifest in our lives, we ought to seek the gift of transformation rather than restoration. We are an Easter people, Easter calls us to the gift of new beginnings, so rather than being restored to who or what we were, let us seek ways of embracing newness through the gift of transformation.

This week, we read the same Psalm which we read on Ash Wednesday, and so in one way we have almost come full circle. Psalm 51 can be read as a very sorrowful or depressing Psalm, depending on the mood of the reader, but at the heart of the Psalm is a call for renewal: **create in me a clean heart, o God, and renew a right spirit within me**. Again, the Psalmist does not call for a restoration of heart and spirit. The Psalmist calls for the creation of something and a renewal of Spirit, a refreshed and new spirit.

As we steadily move towards our Easter celebrations, which again will be different because of COVID-19, we are encouraged as a community to pray these words daily: **create in me a clean heart, o God, and renew a right spirit within me**. We do so to hear what God is saying to God's Church and so too, to be obedient to God's call.

We continue to pray with each other and for each other.

In the Rectory, we find ourselves operating on minimal sleep, but enjoy having some extra life around us. As a family, we continue to express our sincere and deep gratitude for all your prayers, well wishes and the many gifts we received, and we continue to be excited about our journey here at St. Saviour's.

Please keep a look out for our Palm Sunday, Holy week and Easter programme.
