Holy week starts today with the celebration of Palm Sunday. We symbolically welcome Jesus into Jerusalem. In as much as this occasion is portrayed as a joyous occasion, we now know that this triumphal entry into Jerusalem culminates in the pain and suffering on Good Friday, before we can get to our Easter celebration.

In absorbing the moment of Palm Sunday, we are called to enter Jerusalem with Jesus, but more importantly we are called to reflect on how we welcome Jesus into our lives; a Jesus who enters as a lowly servant, a Jesus who enters on a borrowed donkey.

So, dear friends, as we commence our Holy Week journey, let us immerse ourselves in the Passion story and discover how best we can be part of that story, For Jesus is invited to enter our lives afresh, and in doing so, we enter into the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.
