SERMON

THE SERVICE OF CONFIRMATION

THE INTRODUCTION

Our Lord Jesus Christ gave himself to death on the cross and was raised again for the salvation of humankind.

Baptism is the sacrament in which, by repentance and faith, we enter into his salvation; we are united with Christ in his death; we are granted the forgiveness at sins we are made members of his Body and we are raised with him to new life in the Spirit.

In Confirmation we come to be filled, through the laying on of hands with the power of the Spirit for worship, witness and service.

THE RENUNCIATION

You, who are to be confirmed, must renew the vows of your baptism, and first, with our own lips and from your heart you must declare your rejection of all that is evil.

Do you renounce the devil and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

I renounce them

Do you renounce the evil powers of this world, which corrupt and destroy what God has created?

I renounce them.

Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you away from the love of God? **I renounce them.**

THE ALLEGIANCE

Now, in allegiance to Christ, you must declare before God and God's Church that you accept the Christian faith into which you were baptized, and in which you will continue to grow,

Do you believe and trust in God the Father who made the world?

I believe and trust in him

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ who redeemed humankind?

I believe and trust in him

Do you believe and trust in his Holy Spirit who gives life to the people of God?

I believe and trust in him

The Bishop says to the congregation

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith.
We believe and trust in one God
Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Will you, who are now to be confirmed, live in obedience to God's laws, as a loyal member of God's Church?

THE CONFIRMATION

The Bishop stands before those who are to confirmed and calls the congregation to prayer.

Silence is kept

Come, Holy Ghost, our souls inspire, And lighten with celestial fire; Thou the anointing Spirit art, Who dost thy sevenfold gifts impart.

Thy blessed unction from above Is comfort, life and fire of love; Enable with perpetual light The dullness of our blinded sight.

Anoint and cheer our soiled face With the abundance of thy grace; Keep far our foes, give peace at home; Where thou art guide np ill can come.

Teach us to know the Father, Son, And thee, of Both, to be but One; That through the ages all along This maybe our endless song,

Praise to thy eternal merit, Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Amen

The Bishop stands and says

Our help is in the Name of the Lord **Who has made heaven and earth**

Blessed be the Name of the Lord **Now and for ever. Amen**

The Bishop stretches out his hands towards those to be confirmed and says

Almighty and ever living God You have given your servants new birth In baptism by water and the Spirit And have forgiven them all their sins.
Let your Holy Spirit rest upon them:
The Spirit of wisdom and understanding;
The Spirit of discernment and inner strength;
The Spirit of knowledge and true godliness;
And fill them with.
The Spirit of the fear of the Lord
Now and for ever.

Amen

The candidates kneel in order before the Bishop.

N I sign you with the sign of the cross and I lay my hand upon you.

He lays his hand on their heads saying

Lord, confirm and strengthen with your Holy Spirit this your child and empower him/her for your service.

Amen

When all have been confirmed, the Bishop leads the congregation in saying

Defend, O Lord, these your servants with your heavenly grace That they may continue yours for ever And daily increase in your Holy Spirit more and more Until they come to your everlasting kingdom.

The Bishop says

Heavenly Father
We pray for your servants
Upon whom we have now laid our hands.
May your fatherly hand ever be over them
Your Holy Spirit ever be with them.
Sustain them continually
with the body and blood of your Son
and so lead them in the knowledge
and obedience of your word
that in the end
they may enjoy the fullness of eternal life;
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

The First Eucharistic Prayer

It is right and indeed our duty and joy, Lord and heavenly Father, God almighty and eternal, always and everywhere to give thanks through Jesus Christ, your only Son our Lord;

Because through him you have created everything from the beginning and formed us in your own image;

Through him you delivered us from the slavery of sin, when you gave him to be born as man, to die on the cross and to rise again for us;

Through him you claimed us as your own people when you enthroned him with you in heaven, and through him sent out your Holy Spirit, the giver of life;

And now we give you thanks because in him you received us as your children, made us citizens of your kingdom, and give us the Holy Spirit to guide us into all truth.

Therefore, with angels and archangels, and with all the company of heaven, we acclaim you and declare the greatness of your glory; we praise you now and for ever saying:

Holy, holy Lord
God of power of and might
heaven and earth are full of glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.

For on the night that he was betrayed he took bread, and when he had given you thanks, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples saying, 'Take this and eat; this is my body which is given for you; do this in remembrance of me.'

So too after supper he took the cup, and when he had given you thanks, he gave it to them saying, Drink of it all of you; for this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins; whenever you drink it, do this in remembrance of me.'

So we acclaim the victory of Christ

Dying you destroyed our death rising you restored our life. Lord Jesus, come in glory

Holy Father, with these your gifts, we your people celebrate before you the one perfect sacrifice of Christ our Lord, his rising from the dead and his ascending to the glory of heaven.
