RECTORS NOTE

Advent tide greetings friends and family of St. Saviour's.

Today, the third Sunday of Advent, we are invited to shift our attention to the pink candle - the candle of Joy. In a world with so much despair and hopelessness, many of us find it challenging to express our joy. Many of us struggle to recognise joy. As a faith community we are meant to be a people who rise to the occasion and express our joy in the face of despair and hardship, because we know that our joy resides in God, the same God who sends us Jesus, as a light in our dark world.

Today, we are called to embrace the light of Joy; allow it to illuminate our lives and share it with God's people. It is indeed a joy, we experience while facing so many dark moments, knowing the love of God is ever present. It is a joy that we are still able to gather as fragments of our community. It is a joy that comes from knowing that God is good all the time.

May the gift of joy abound in your life this week as you continue your Advent journey of HOLY waiting.

ADVENT CANDLE LIGHTING LITURGY¹

WEEK 3: JOY

READER A: Joy is the space between your breath and your laughter.

READER B: Joy is a hand wrapped around yours.

READER C: Joy is your heart beating in sync with someone else's heart.

READER D: Joy is that first day of a new season, and the intoxicating hope it brings.

READER A: Joy is dancing in the kitchen and singing in your car.

READER B: Joy is the first cry of a newborn baby.

READER C: Joy is contagious.

READER D: Joy is a song.

READER A: Joy is the daughter of gratitude.

READER B: Joy is the heart of praise.

READER C: Today, we plant our feet in joy. For much of Advent we assume the position of leaning forward, longing for the moment where God will break into this world once more. However, today we stop leaning to remember with gratitude all that God has already done for us, through us, and around us.

(Reader A lights the candle at this time)

READER D: Thus, today we light the candle of joy as a thank you for laughter and for hands that hold ours. We light the candle of joy for the change in seasons, for kitchen dance parties, and for newborns. And most importantly, we light the candle of joy as a sign of gratitude for a God who makes water in the desert, heals the sick, offers sight to the blind, and who knows us by name. If joy is the song of praise, then joy is where we should stand.

The priest prays:

Loving God, all of creation praise you, for it was you who hung the stars, and you who made our beating hearts. Thus, as we anticipate the birth of your son, fill our hearts not only with hope and peace, which we so desperately need, but also with joy. For when the nights feel too long, and the darkness too strong, you light the way for us.

In Your holy name we so gratefully pray, Amen.
