Allow me, on behalf of Samantha, Sarah, Noah and myself, to express a sincere and warm thank you to you, our family here at St. Saviours for your well wishes and prayers. Noah is making good progress and at the time of writing remains in hospital as he was born premature. We value your love, care and support.

This coming week marks a milestone in my journey as Rector of St. Saviour's. It was last year this time, that my nomination as your Rector was accepted by Parish Council, presented by the Archdeacon and Churchwardens. It was on the 12th of March 2020 that this daunting task of being obedient to the call of God to serve God as Priest in this Gods Church. Never did I think God would call me to serve in St. Saviours. It was with humility and trembling by which I accepted the call to serve you the people of this Parish.

Looking back, one year later, I can only but praise God from whom al blessings flow. My interview took place just before the President announced a National Lockdown, it was in the midst of serious load shedding and at a time when here in our Diocese we were going through a transition of episcopal leadership. It was an exciting but scary time. Ironically, as I entered the Church premises for my interview, load shedding struck, and my interview was conducted by torch and candlelight. It is this ongoing image which carries me through my days as Rector of this wonderful Parish.

This image is of dim light seeking to shine a tad brighter. The brightness is not brought about by me, but rather the brightness is brought about through the ushering in of a new community of Priest and People. As I look back a year later, amidst Lockdown, amidst a delay in my institution, amidst an unorthodox service of institution limited to 10 people, the light continues to shine. It might not be shining at its brightest but has not been extinguished either. This gives me hope, hope that as a community of Priest and People collaborating to do what God has called us too, we will continue to shine our lights, as dim as it might seem for now, with the goal of driving out the darkness through the true light, Jesus Christ.

Friends, I continue to pray with you and for you, and trust you will continue to pray for me. As Lockdown eases and we find ways of being in contact whilst staying safe, I invite you the Parishioners of St. Saviour's, to set up some time. Come and visit me in the office and let's get to meet one another, and TOGETHER seek ways of shining our light in this part of Gods vineyard.
