Rector's Christmas Message

Dear Friends.

During our Advent journey, we spent time preparing ourselves; individually and as a faith community for that which is to be birthed afresh in our lives at Christmas. We now, after weeks of preparation have endured the pains of labour and now come to enjoy the wonderful gift of new life. As a people we have endured much over the last few months, many of us have become totally disillusioned with the state of our country and by extension the lack of response by the Church, and rightfully so. We now spend more time without electricity than ever before. Violent crime and unemployment statistics do not make for comfortable reading and our grocery baskets are now simply about essentials and almost never include any form of luxury. While the cost of credit and usage thereof is on the increase.

Yet today, on this Christmas Day of celebration we are reminded that more than 2000 years ago, a child was born to us, to be the light which drives out all darkness. More than 2000 years ago, the odds were stacked against the Holy Family: they were disgraced and dishonoured. There was no place in the inn, and Herod was on a different mission. However amidst it all, Jesus Christ is born and restores order in the World.

Today, as we consider our World, and what we are facing, we are called to come before God, and allow the Christ child to be born afresh into our lives, the one who is able to drive out the darkness of the world. We are challenged today not to get caught up in this darkness, but to seek the light; Jesus Christ.

As you celebrate with loved ones this Christmas; as you remember those who are no longer around; as you reflect on the goodness of God over that last year, may the Christ child be born anew in you and in our World.

From my family to your family: may you have a BLESSED CHRISTMAS, and may the love of the Christ child abound in your life and may all that is good blossom in all you do.

THE THIRD EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

He is the word through whom you made the universe, the Saviour you sent to redeem us. By the power of the Holy Spirit he took flesh and was born of the Virgin Mary. For our sake he opened his arms on the cross; he put an end to death and revealed the resurrection. In this he fulfilled your will and won for you a holy people.

And now we give you thanks because by the power of the Holy Spirit he took our nature upon him and was born of the Virgin Mary his mother, that being himself without sin He might make us clean from all sin.

And so we join the angels and the saints in proclaiming your glory as we sing:

Holy, holy, holy Lord God of power and might heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest. Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

Congregation sits/kneels

Lord, you are holy indeed, the fountain of all holiness. Let your Spirit come upon these gifts to make them holy, so that they may become for us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Before he was given up to death, a death he freely accepted, he took bread and gave you thanks. He broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: 'Take this, all of you, and eat it: this is my body which will be given up for you.'

When supper was ended, he took the cup. Again he gave you thanks and praise, gave the cup to his disciples, and said: 'Take this, all of you, and drink from it: this is the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and everlasting covenant. It will be shed for you and for all so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me.'

So we proclaim the mystery of faith

Christ has died Christ is risen Christ will come again.

In memory of his death and resurrection, we offer you, Father, this life-giving bread, this saving cup.

We thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you. May all of us who share in the body and blood of Christ be brought together in unity by the Holy Spirit. Lord, remember your Church throughout the world; make us grow in love, together with Joshua our bishop, and all the clergy. Remember our brothers and sisters who have gone to their rest in the hope of rising again; bring them and all the departed into the light of your presence. Have mercy on us all; make us worthy to share eternal life with Mary, the virgin mother of God, with the apostles, and with all the saints who have done your will throughout the ages. May we praise you in union with them, and give you glory through your Son, Jesus Christ.

Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever. **Amen**

As Christ has taught us we are bold to pray:

Our Father in heaven hallowed be your Name your kingdom come your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen

Grant us therefore, gracious Lord so to eat the flesh of your dear Son Jesus Christ and to drink his blood that we may evermore dwell in him and he in us.

Draw near and receive the Body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you, and his blood which he shed for your, feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.
