Rector's Patronal Message

Desmond Martin in his Phd Thesis captures the history of the churches built by Robert and Sophia Gray. He titles it The churches of Bishop Robert Gray & Mrs Sophia Gray: an historical and architectural review. In this thesis he captures the origins of St. Saviour's, Claremont. We have printed copies of the relevant pages and I encourage you to read more at <https://open.uct.ac.za/handle/11427/10637> .

What strikes me about the historical planting of this, our church, is that both Bishop Robert Gray and his wife Sophia had chosen to invest their own money to ensure the church construction is completed: to the extent that Robert Gray writes to his children and instructs them that if he dies before the debt is paid, they must please do their best to pay it off.

This is the beginning of our story, a story where all of us have made some kind of investment, whether it be our time, our money, or our skills. This is a church built on the investment of people. Surely, we can deduce that their monetary investment is influenced by their love for God, God's Church and God's people.

It's on this basis that I theme our celebration for this year: **"An invested heart, creates a thriving Church"**.

The economists and finance people will tell us that when we speak of an investment, we must consider the risks and the aim must always be to yield rewards. So to they will remind us, the bigger the risk, the greater the reward.

As we celebrate our 169th patronal festival, we are called to reflect on our investment: How invested are our hearts in our church or how have invested are our hearts in our Church? What are the kind of dividends we are receiving from our investment in St. Saviour's? How do we ensure that those who come and invest their hearts in our Church, receive the best possible results? Is our Church a place of high risk for people wanting to invest their hearts, or does the reward outweigh the risk? Like the Grays, we can only invest from a place of love. Our investment is influenced by how we love God, God's Church and God's people.

I can only speak from my vantage point, which is a place of acknowledging the gift of great reward. We currently operate as efficiently and effectively as we do, because of the investment made by those who went before us. As I constantly say, we stand on the shoulders of giants. The challenge remains that the market is changing (to keep the finance metaphor going). We are now entering a recession as a Church, financially and spiritually. We are in a space where our resilience will be tested. The value of shares seems to be on a flat trajectory, rather than an upward one. Of course, the beauty is, that we have an opportunity to change the market. We have an opportunity to renew our investment and to change the landscape of the market to ensure that our collective investment yields better results.

Thus, when we speak of an invested heart, creating a thriving Church, we are challenged to reflect on the way in which we love. When we invest our hearts, into this our Church, it comes from the place that produces love; it comes from the organ in our bodies that gives life. So, when we invest our love into this place and its people, when we invest our love into our organisation and parish events, when we invest our LOVE into one another, the church can only thrive.

As we ready ourselves for our 170th celebration, this is a clarion call to invest our love into each other, to invest our heart into Gods Church and together let us ensure this beautiful Church, built on the gifts of others, together with our contribution, will be a thriving Church.

Next time we are asked to respond or feel the need to respond to anything regarding this our Church, let us start with asking ourselves: how will this affect my investment? How will this bring to life my invested heart? How will love be brought to life?

I look forward to our continued journey, as priest and people.

It will be shed for you and for all so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me.'

In memory of his death and resurrection, we offer you, Father, this life-giving bread, this saving cup.

We thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you. May all of us who share in the body and blood of Christ be brought together in unity by the Holy Spirit. Lord, remember your Church throughout the world; make us grow in love, together with *N* our bishop, and all the clergy.

Remember our brothers and sisters who have gone to their rest in the hope of rising again; bring them and all the departed into the light of your presence.

Have mercy on us all; make us worthy to share eternal life with Mary, the virgin mother of God, with the apostles, and with all the saints who have done your will throughout the ages. May we praise you in union with them, and give you glory through your Son, Jesus Christ.

Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever.
