Rectors Easter message

Christ is risen; He is risen indeed. ALLELUIA, ALLELUIA!!

Easter Greetings Friends.

Year after year, during the season of Easter we are reminded of the gift of God's redeeming love for all. We start this journey on Ash Wednesday with a reminder of our mortality and the call to a space of dedicated prayer, fasting and alms-giving.

It was in my Ash Wednesday reflection that I reflected on that which God calls us to fast from, and I suggested that God calls us to fast from all that is not good, all that is not of God. Of course, now that Lent is over and our fasting from everything that we gave up for lent comes to an end. The question is: do we go back to our old habits? It is my prayer that as you responded to fast from all that is not of God, all that is not good, that you, like me, were able to recognise the joy and grace of God when we wipe away the 'other stuff', and we simply focus on doing good and that which is of God.

So, as we come to another Easter, after having made our way through another lent, one of the significant thoughts which I have been journeying with is to model and shape our lives according to the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, as individuals but more importantly as a faith community here at St. Saviour's. Through doing so, modelling and shaping our lives according to the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, we can engage with who or what it is that causes us pain and suffering. We can engage with those who constantly crucify us. We can recognise the pain and suffering we cause others. In doing so we acknowledge that the darkness of the tomb and entering spaces of darkness in our life and that of our community, the certainty of our faith and the gift of light and life will prevail, through our living out the resurrection.

After 3 years in the Parish, I am now ready to share my vision for us, God's people here at St. Saviour's.

My vision as the one called to enable and facilitate ministry, is a vision of a community modelling the gift of the resurrection. We are called to be a faith community which embodies and daily lives out what it means to be a new people, a people of hope who enjoys the gift of new life and also offers new life to others. Every resurrection is preceded by death, so we will have to endure the bitter pains of death and suffering But I have a vision for us to be a people, a community who lives out the resurrection, of new life, of new light. That's my vision.

This year already, we have had glimpses of this community living out the resurrection. Just before Lent, we held a fruitful and dare I say 'successful' vestry meeting, followed by Ash Wednesday services which drew many people into our Church building. Our Lenten program reflected on the Eucharist. We prayed that we would become what we receive. It was a space of encountering for many. So too was our online Bible study which looked at the book of Job.

Our Palm Sunday service has become a highlight for so many, as we made our procession of witness. We enjoyed the magnificence of our church building decorated and beautified with palm branches. This started a pilgrimage to the cross, which led us to follow the stations of the cross in a very different way this year. We watched the *Via Delarosa*.

More than 60 people attended our service of prayer and worship so beautifully led by the Young people of our church on Holy Tuesday. Wednesday in Holy week has become auspicious for the Sacrament of Holy Unction(Anointing) administered as we allowed God's grace to abound in our lives, offering healing and wholeness. And so we made our way to the Good Friday cross. This, of course, was followed by the Triduum, which included our Good Friday service where we were called to pray for ourselves and one another, using the cross as a symbol of prayer. And here we are today: The day of resurrection.

Indeed, we have it in us to be a community who lives out the resurrection. I look forward to being part of this resurrection experience, with you, my sisters and brothers, as we continue our pilgrimage of faith.

Allow me to use this space to express a vote of sincere thanks and appreciation to all of you for who you are and what you do. Thank you to our support staff: Rozanne in the Parish office, Alex, Aggie and Elliot on the Parish grounds. Your commitment to God and God's Church through your work is valued and appreciated. To the individuals and organisations involved in all our services: thank you for your ministry.

May the gift of the resurrection, offer each of us, the joy of new beginnings!

From Samantha, Sarah, Noah and me: may you enjoy a blessed Easter and may the love of God abound in your lives. Please remember us in your prayers, as we continue to pray for you.

We gather in the graveyard. This is symbolic of gathering in a space which conjures emotions of death, and then as the candles are lit, and we move into the Church, we move to a space of light and resurrection-the gift of Easter.

The Blessing of the Fire and the Lighting of the Easter Candle

Dear friends in Christ, on this holy morn, when our Lord Jesus Christ passed from death to life, the Church invites her children throughout the world to come together in vigil and prayer.

This is the Passover of the Lord when we venerate him in the mystery of his death and resurrection. Through the celebration of the Paschal Mystery in word and sacrament he renews our faith and hope, and gives us a share in his victory over death and his eternal life with the Father.

The fire is lit in silence.

The Priest blesses it.

Father

We share in the light of your glory
Through your Son, the Light of the world:
Sanctify this new fire
And inflame us with new hope
Purify our minds by this Easter celebration
And bring us to the feast of eternal light
We ask this through Christ our Lord.
Amen

The Candle is lit from the newly blessed fire, the Priest saying.

May the Light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds

The Candle is brought into the Church and its light is passed to all the people. The people move into Church.

The newly lit Easter candle is processed into the Church. At various positions the deacon pauses and exclaims:

Christ our Light

Thanks be to God

In the body of the church the deacon lifts the Candle high for the second time

Christ our Light

Thanks be to God

The deacon arrives before the altar and face the people lifts the Candle high for the third time

Christ our Light

Thanks be to God

THE EASTER PROCLAMATION (Exultant)

Rejoice, heavenly powers! Sing, choirs of angels! Exult, all creation around God's throne! Jesus Christ, our King, is risen! Sound the trumpet of salvation!

Rejoice, O earth, in shining splendour, radiant in the brightness of your King! Christ has conquered! Glory fills you! Darkness vanishes for ever!

Rejoice, O Mother Church! Exult in glory! The risen Saviour shines upon you! Let this place resound with joy, echoing the mighty song of all God's people!

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give him thanks and praise.

It is truly right that with full hearts and minds and voices we should praise the unseen God, the all-powerful Father and his only Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.

For Christ has ransomed us with his blood and paid for us the price of Adam's sin to our eternal Father!

This is our Passover feast, when Christ, the true Lamb, is slain, whose blood consecrates the homes of all believers.

This is the day when first you saved our fathers: you freed the people of Israel from their slavery and led them dry-shod through the sea. This is the night when the pillar of fire destroyed the darkness of sin!

This is the day when Christians everywhere, washed clean of sin and freed from all defilement, are restored to grace and grow together in holiness.

This is the day when Jesus Christ broke the chains of death and rose triumphant from the grave.

Father, how wonderful your care for us! How boundless your merciful love! To ransom a slave you gave away your Son.

O happy fault, O necessary sin of Adam, which gained for us so great a Redeemer!

The power of this holy day dispels all evil, washes guilt away, restores lost innocence, brings mourners joy.

Day truly blessed when heaven is wedded to earth and man is reconciled with God!

Therefore, heavenly Father, in the joy of this night, receive our evening sacrifice of praise, your Church's solemn offering.

Accept this Easter candle. May it always dispel the darkness of the night.

May the morning Star which never sets find this flame still burning: Christ, that Morning Star, who came back from the dead, and shed his peaceful light on all mankind, your Son who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

The reading of Scripture has been an important part of the vigil. Six readings from the Old Testament fellow, telling of God's acts in history.

The church lights are put on. The people extinguish their candles and sit.

The Priest addresses them in these our similar words.

Dear Friends in Christ, let us begin our solemn Vigil. Let us listen attentively to the word of God, recalling how again and again he saved his people and, in the fullness of time, sent the only-begotten Son to be our Redeemer.

The First Reading - Mary Davids

The story tells how God created Adam. Tonight we celebrate our new creation in Jesus Christ, who breathes the Holy Spirit upon us.

Genesis 2: 4-9

The Second Reading - Ruth Fry-Snyders

This story witness to the common human experience of separation from God through disobedience, and hints at redemption through a descendant of the woman

Genesis 3: 1-19

The Third Reading - Anthea Fabing

In obedience to God Abraham was prepared to sacrifice his only son, Isaacs. But in response to Abraham's obedience God refused the sacrifice, though he would not refuse the sacrifice of his own Son Jesus, the Lamb of God.

Genesis 22: 1-18

The Fourth Reading - Pam Fortune

During their escape from Egypt, God led the Israelites safely through the waters of the Red Sea in which the pursuing Egyptians were destroyed, foreshadowing our own deliverance through the waters of baptism.

Exodus 14: 15-15:1a

The Fifth Reading – Jonathan Carelse

At Mount Sinai God established the Israelites as his chosen people by making his covenant with them. This first covenant was sealed in the blood of animal sacrifices. The new covenant would be sealed in the blood of the Lamb of God.

Exodus 24: 3-8

The Sixth Reading – David Davids

God promised to purify the people of Israel, to renew them in heart and spirit, and to make them his own people. God did this not only for their own sake, but that through them the world might come to know him.

Ezekiel 36: 22-28

SERMON

THE RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS

Dear friends, this water will be used to remind us of our baptism. Let us ask God to bless it and to keep us faithful to the Spirit he has given us.

Through the waters of the Red Sea you brought your people out of slavery in Egypt, and in the waters of Jordan your Son was anointed with the Holy Spirit.

We ask you now to bless this water to our use.

May it remind us of our baptism that, renewed by your Spirit, we may rejoice with all who are baptised this Easter.

Grant this through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Dear friends in Christ, this is the day for which we have been preparing during Lent. We have come to know more clearly the love of Christ for us. On Palm Sunday we went to Jerusalem with him. We followed him day by day until, on Good Friday, we stood at the foot of the cross as he died for us in the faithfulness of his love. Tonight we rejoice in that great love. As we celebrate the Paschal Mystery of his death and resurrection, we remember that, at our baptism, we were buried with Christ and raised with him to newness of life. Let us now show our thankfulness by renewing the solemn pledges which were then made: to renounce the world, the flesh and the devil, to believe the Christian faith, and to keep God's holy will and commandments.

I ask you therefore

Do you renounce the wickedness of the world, its greed for possessions, power and status? **Yes, I renounce them all**

Do you renounce all that corrupts our human nature, pride, selfishness and lust? **Yes, I renounce them all**

Do you renounce the devil, the author of all evil and the father of lies? **Yes. I renounce him**

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, the maker of all? I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in his Son, Jesus Christ, the redeemer of the world? I believe and trust in him

Do you believe and trust in his Holy Spirit, the giver of life? I believe and trust in him

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith.
We believe and trust in one God
Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Will you faithfully play your part in the life and fellowship of the Church? With God's help I will

Will you gladly obey the commandments of God and seek to do his will?

With God's help I will

Will you by your life and witness share in the Church's mission to proclaim the gospel, and to set forward peace and justice among all people?

With God's help I will

Almighty God who gives you the will to do all these things, grant you also the power to perform them, that he may complete the work which he has begun in you; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

You have renewed the vows which were made when you were baptized into Christ. Receive now the sprinkling of this water, as a reminder of your baptism.

For our sake he opened his arms on the cross; he put an end to death and revealed the resurrection. In this he fulfilled your will and won for you a holy people.

And now on this Easter night we give you thanks for him, who is our paschal sacrifice, and praise you with a joy too great for words. He is the true Lamb who took away the sin of the world. By his death he conquered death, by rising he restored life to us.

And so we join the angels and the saints in proclaiming your glory as we sing:

Holy, holy, holy Lord God of power and might

heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

Hosanna in the highest.

Lord, you are holy indeed, the fountain of all holiness. Let your Spirit come upon these gifts to make them holy, so that they may become for us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Before he was given up to death, a death he freely accepted, he took bread and gave you thanks. He broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: 'Take this, all of you, and eat it: this is my body which will be given up for you.'

When supper was ended, he took the cup. Again he gave you thanks and praise, gave the cup to his disciples, and said: 'Take this, all of you, and drink from it: this is the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and everlasting covenant. It will be shed for you and for all so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me.'

So we proclaim the mystery of faith

Christ has died Christ is risen Christ will come again.

In memory of his death and resurrection, we offer you, Father, this life-giving bread, this saving cup.

We thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you. May all of us who share in the body and blood of Christ be brought together in unity by the Holy Spirit. Lord, remember your Church throughout the world; make us grow in love, together with *N* our bishop, and all the clergy. Remember our brothers and sisters who have gone to their rest in the hope of rising again; bring them and all the departed into the light of your presence.

Have mercy on us all; make us worthy to share eternal life with Mary, the virgin mother of God, with the apostles, and with all the saints who have done your will throughout the ages. May we praise you in union with them, and give you glory through your Son, Jesus Christ.

Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever. **Amen**

As Christ has taught us we are bold to pray:

Our Father in heaven hallowed be your Name your kingdom come your will be done on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Save us from the time of trial and deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and forever. Amen

THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD

The bread which we break is it not a sharing of the body of Christ? We, who are many, are one body for we all partake of the one bread.

Jesus, Lamb of God: have mercy on us. Jesus, bearer of our sins: have mercy on us. Jesus, redeemer of the world: give us your peace.

We do not presume to come to this your table, merciful Lord trusting in our own righteousness but in your manifold and great mercies.

We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under your table but you are the same Lord whose nature is always to have mercy.

Grant us therefore, gracious Lord so to eat the flesh of your dear Son Jesus Christ and to drink his blood that we may evermore dwell in him and he in us.

Draw near and receive the Body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you, and his blood which he shed for your, feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.
