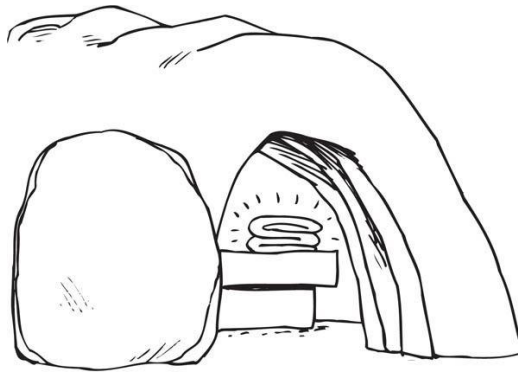

Rectors Easter message

ALLELUIA, Christ is risen!! Easter greetings, St. Saviour's family.

This is my second Easter as Rector of this beautiful Parish, but my first without the limitations and restrictions of COVID 19 rules and laws. WOW!!! Praise God from whom all blessings flow. It has been a joyous journey from Ash Wednesday up to this point.

We commenced our Lenten journey with at least 260 people passing through our doors over two services on Ash Wednesday, this was followed with steady weekly attendance on a Wednesday as we journeyed through the book of Esther. Inviting each one of us to recognise our own Esther story.

Through my personal and prayerful encounters with the book of Esther, I was led to call a meeting with the Layminsters, to discuss what it is we need to do as a Church, to feed our people spiritually. To this extent after much prayer and deep consideration, I am thrilled to announce that we will be running an ALPHA series this year. It will be the start of a spiritual journey in the life of the parish and will hopefully birth many new exciting ministries and revive the ministries which were stifled as a result of COVID, details to follow soon.

Our Holy Week was off to a blessed start, with a wonderful Palm Sunday procession, it was so good to see so many back at Church and living out the gift of community. Holy week was spirit filled, with stations of the cross, Taize prayer and meditation service as well as the administration of holy unction in the context of the Eucharist. The Triduum (Maundy Thursday- Easter Day) is indeed a time of mystery and wonder and for that we thank God.

As we celebrate the gift of the resurrection, and reflect on the empty tomb, let us hold onto the power of God; the power of love. For many the past two years have been difficult and added to that has been the challenge of recognising Gods love amongst us. We gather in the graveyard. This is a symbolic of gathering in a space which conjures emotions of death, and then as the candles are lit, and we move into the Church, we move to a space of resurrection-the gift of Easter.

The Blessing of the Fire and the Lighting of the Easter Candle

Dear friends in Christ, on this holy morn, when our Lord Jesus Christ passed from death to life, the Church invites her children throughout the world to come together in vigil and prayer.

This is the Passover of the Lord when we venerate him in the mystery of his death and resurrection. Through the celebration of the Paschal Mystery in word and sacrament he renews our faith and hope, and gives us a share in his victory over death and his eternal life with the Father.

The fire is lit in silence.

The Priest blesses it.

Father

We share in the light of your glory

Through your Son, the Light of the world:

Sanctify this new fire

And inflame us with new hope

Purify our minds by this Easter celebration

And bring us to the feast of eternal light

We ask this through Christ our Lord.

Amen

The Candle is lit from the newly blessed fire, the Priest saying.

May the Light of Christ, rising in glory, dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds

The Candle is brought into the Church and its light is passed to all the people. The people move into Church.

The newly lit Easter candle is processed into the Church. At various positions the deacon pauses and exclaims:

Christ our Light

Thanks be to God

In the body of the church the deacon lifts the Candle high for the second time

Christ our Light

Thanks be to God

The deacon arrives before the altar and face the people lifts the Candle high for the third time

Christ our Light

Thanks be to God

The Easter Proclamation (Exultet)

*Rejoice, heavenly powers! Sing, choirs of angels! Exult, all creation around God's throne!
Jesus Christ, our King, is risen! Sound the trumpet of salvation!*

*Rejoice, O earth, in shining splendour, radiant in the brightness of your King!
Christ has conquered! Glory fills you! Darkness vanishes for ever!*

*Rejoice, O Mother Church! Exult in glory! The risen Saviour shines upon you!
Let this place resound with joy, echoing the mighty song of all God's people!*

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give him thanks and praise.

*It is truly right that with full hearts and minds and voices we should praise the unseen God,
the all-powerful Father and his only Son, our Lord Jesus Christ.*

*For Christ has ransomed us with his blood and paid for us the price of Adam's sin
to our eternal Father!*

*This is our Passover feast, when Christ, the true Lamb, is slain, whose blood consecrates
the homes of all believers.*

*This is the day when first you saved our fathers: you freed the people of Israel from their
slavery and led them dry-shod through the sea. This is the night when the pillar of fire
destroyed the darkness of sin!*

*This is the day when Christians everywhere, washed clean of sin
and freed from all defilement, are restored to grace and grow together in holiness.*

*This is the day when Jesus Christ broke the chains of death and rose triumphant from the
grave.*

*Father, how wonderful your care for us! How boundless your merciful love!
To ransom a slave you gave away your Son.*

O happy fault, O necessary sin of Adam, which gained for us so great a Redeemer!

The power of this holy day dispels all evil, washes guilt away, restores lost innocence, brings mourners joy.

Day truly blessed when heaven is wedded to earth and man is reconciled with God!

Therefore, heavenly Father, in the joy of this night, receive our evening sacrifice of praise, your Church's solemn offering.

Accept this Easter candle. May it always dispel the darkness of the night.

May the morning Star which never sets find this flame still burning: Christ, that Morning Star, who came back from the dead, and shed his peaceful light on all mankind, your Son who lives and reigns for ever and ever.

Amen.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

The reading of Scripture has been an important part of the vigils. Six readings from the Old Testament follow, telling of God's acts in history.

The church lights are put on. The people extinguish their candles and sit.

The Priest addresses them in these our similar words.

Dear Friends in Christ, let us begin our solemn Vigil. Let us listen attentively to the word of God, recalling how again and again he saved his people and, in the fullness of time, sent the only-begotten Son to be our Redeemer.

The readings follow.

The First Reading – Anthea Fabing

The story tells how God created Adam. Tonight we celebrate our new creation in Jesus Christ, who breathes the Holy Spirit upon us.

Genesis 2: 4-9

The Second Reading – Ruth Fry-Snyders

This story witness to the common human experience of separation from God through disobedience, and hints at redemption through a descendant of the woman

Genesis 3: 1-19

The Third Reading – Noel Sasman

In obedience to God Abraham was prepared to sacrifice his only son, Isaacs. But in response to Abraham's obedience God refused the sacrifice, though he would not refuse the sacrifice of his own Son Jesus, the Lamb of God.

Genesis 22: 1-18

The Fourth Reading - Pam Fortune

During their escape from Egypt, God led the Israelites safely through the waters of the Red Sea in which the pursuing Egyptians were destroyed, foreshadowing our own deliverance through the waters of baptism.

Exodus 14: 15-15:1a

The Fifth Reading – Mervyn Johnson

At Mount Sinai God established the Israelites as his chosen people by making his covenant was sealed in the blood of animal sacrifices. The new covenant would be sealed in the blood of the Lamb of God.

Exodus 24: 3-8

The Sixth Reading – David Davids

God promised to purify the people of Israel, to renew them in heart and spirit, and to make them his own people. God did this not only for their own sake, but that through them the world might come to know him.

Ezekiel 36: 22-28

Sermon

THE RENEWAL OF BAPTISMAL VOWS

Dear friends, this water will be used to remind us of our baptism. Let us ask God to bless it and to keep us faithful to the Spirit he has given us.

Father, we give you thanks for your gift of life-giving water.

Through the waters of the Red Sea you brought your people out of slavery in Egypt, and in the waters of Jordan your Son was anointed with the Holy Spirit.

As he hung on the cross, water and blood flowed from his side. Through the waters of baptism you delivered us from sin and raised us to new life.

We ask you now to bless this water to our use.

May it remind us of our baptism that, renewed by your Spirit, we may rejoice with all who are baptized this Easter.

Grant this through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Amen

Dear friends in Christ, this is the day for which we have been preparing during Lent. We have come to know more clearly the love of Christ for us. On Palm Sunday we went to Jerusalem with him. We followed him day by day until, on Good Friday, we stood at the foot of the cross as he died for us in the faithfulness of his love. Tonight we rejoice in that great love. As we celebrate the Paschal Mystery of his death and resurrection, we remember that, at our baptism, we were buried with Christ and raised with him to newness of life. Let us now show our thankfulness by renewing the solemn pledges which were then made: to renounce the world, the flesh and the devil, to believe the Christian faith, and to keep God's holy will and commandments.

I ask you therefore

Do you renounce the wickedness of the world, its greed for possessions, power and status?

Yes, I renounce them all

Do you renounce all that corrupts our human nature, pride, selfishness and lust?

Yes, I renounce them all

Do you renounce the devil, the author of all evil and the father of lies?

Yes, I renounce him

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, the maker of all?

I believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in his Son, Jesus Christ, the redeemer of the world?

I believe and trust in him

Do you believe and trust in his Holy Spirit, the giver of life?

I believe and trust in him

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith.

**We believe and trust in one God
Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.**

Will you faithfully play your part in the life and fellowship of the Church?

With God's help I will

Will you gladly obey the commandments of God and seek to do his will?

With God's help I will

Will you by your life and witness share in the Church's mission to proclaim the gospel, and to set forward peace and justice among all people?

With God's help I will

Almighty God who gives you the will to do all these things, grant you also the power to perform them, that he may complete the work which he has begun in you; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

You have renewed the vows which were made when you were baptized into Christ. Receive now the sprinkling of this water, as a reminder of your baptism.

THE THIRD EUCHARISTIC PRAYER

The Lord be with you

And also with you

Lift up your hearts

We lift them to the Lord

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God

It is right to give him thanks and praise

Father, it is our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks through your beloved Son, Jesus Christ.

He is the word through whom you made the universe, the Saviour you sent to redeem us. By the power of the Holy Spirit he took flesh and was born of the Virgin Mary. For our sake he opened his arms on the cross; he put an end to death and revealed the resurrection. In this he fulfilled your will and won for you a holy people.

And now on this Easter night we give you thanks for him, who is our paschal sacrifice, and praise you with a joy too great for words. He is the true Lamb who took away the sin of the world. By his death he conquered death, by rising he restored life to us.

And so we join the angels and the saints in proclaiming your glory as we sing:

**Holy, holy, holy Lord
God of power and might
heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest.**

Lord, you are holy indeed, the fountain of all holiness. Let your Spirit come upon these gifts to make them holy, so that they may become for us the body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ.

Before he was given up to death, a death he freely accepted, he took bread and gave you thanks. He broke the bread, gave it to his disciples, and said: 'Take this, all of you, and eat it: this is my body which will be given up for you.'

When supper was ended, he took the cup. Again he gave you thanks and praise, gave the cup to his disciples, and said: 'Take this, all of you, and drink from it: this is the cup of my blood, the blood of the new and everlasting covenant. It will be shed for you and for all so that sins may be forgiven. Do this in memory of me.'

So we proclaim the mystery of faith

**Christ has died
Christ is risen
Christ will come again.**

In memory of his death and resurrection, we offer you, Father, this life-giving bread, this saving cup.

We thank you for counting us worthy to stand in your presence and serve you. May all of us who share in the body and blood of Christ be brought together in unity by the Holy Spirit. Lord, remember your Church throughout the world; make us grow in love, together with *N* our bishop, and all the clergy. Remember our brothers and sisters who have gone to their rest in the hope of rising again; bring them and all the departed into the light of your presence.

Have mercy on us all; make us worthy to share eternal life with Mary, the virgin mother of God, with the apostles, and with all the saints who have done your will throughout the ages. May we praise you in union with them, and give you glory through your Son, Jesus Christ.

Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours, almighty Father, for ever and ever. **Amen**

As Christ has taught us we are bold to pray:

**Our Father in heaven
hallowed be your Name
your kingdom come your will be done
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Save us from the time of trial
and deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power, and the glory
are yours now and forever. Amen**

THE BREAKING OF THE BREAD

The bread which we break is it not a sharing of the body of Christ?

We, who are many, are one body for we all partake of the one bread.

Jesus, Lamb of God: have mercy on us.

Jesus, redeemer of the world: give us your peace.

**We do not presume to come to this your table,
merciful Lord trusting in our own righteousness
but in your manifold and great mercies.**

**We are not worthy so much as to gather up
the crumbs under your table but you are the same Lord
whose nature is always to have mercy.**

**Grant us therefore, gracious Lord
so to eat the flesh of your dear Son Jesus Christ and to drink his blood
that we may evermore dwell in him and he in us.**

*Draw near and receive the Body of our Lord Jesus Christ which he gave for you, and his blood
which he shed for your, feed on him in your hearts by faith, with thanksgiving.*
